#### **BEFORE YOU TRANSFER**

If you are a registered nurse, who has also graduated with an associate of arts (AA) degree, you will have fulfilled MSU's general education requirements for completing the bachelor's degree. If you do not have an AA degree in addition to the ASN, you will need to complete additional general education classes. These classes may be taken from Crowder College while you are working on your bachelor's degree.
