

MASTER OF ARTS IN TEACHING AND LEARNING DEGREE PLAN

This cohort-style 33 credit hour degree plan consists of 21 core course credits (five courses)—and all of these will be delivered at (or very near) a school site in your district.

Admission requirements:

Bachelor's degree; certification or the potential for certification to teach P-12

SPECIALIST IN EDUCATON, TEACHER LEADERSHIP DEGREE PLAN

This cohort-style 36 credit hour degree plan, designed to develop teacher-leaders, consists of 24 core course credits. Twenty-one of these credits (five courses) will be delivered in hybrid format—both on-site and online. On site classes will be offered at (or very near) a site in your district.

Admission requirements:

Master's degree; certification, or the potential for certification to teach P-12.

Required courses:

Required professional learning community courses - 18 hours (No transfer courses allowed) and administrative leadership area course - 3 hours.
