

Students who have completed the necessary lower-division coursework are now able to take the courses required to complete the Bachelor of Science in General Business at their community college. Transferring to Missouri State

Students can take the courses needed to finish a bachelor's degree in business at MSU West Plains. The program gives students a broad perspective on the business world, with classes in many different business disciplines. This degree prepares students for a wide variety of careers or to continue their studies at the MBA level.

Students wishing to enter this program should first complete an AA degree or an AS in Business and have at least ten of the twelve COB admission courses completed in order to take upper-division business courses.

Students must speak with an advisor before registering for upper division courses.

Students may take additional lower-division MSU West Plains courses and transfer them to meet Missouri State-Springfield degree requirements. These courses, as well as the COB admission courses, can be taken either prior to graduation from MSU-West Plains or following graduation with an AA or AS in Business.

- JRN 270 (in place of ENG 321)
- CIS 232 transfers as CIS 201, a required Missouri State course.
- FIN 266
- INS 211

Missouri State's 6-hour "Globalization Requirement" may be met using the following MSU-West Plains classes: GRY100, SOC 150, ANT 226 or foreign language courses such as SPN 101. BUS 297 will also meet 3 hours of the "Globalization Requirement" with Springfield advisor approval.

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
