BACHELOR OF APPLIED SCIENCE IN GENERAL AGRICULTURE

Easily transfer your associate of arts or associate of science to MSU and earn your BAS in General Agriculture. As a holder of an AA or AS, you may be able to complete this degree in as little as two years.

- Complete the following (if equivalents were not already completed during your associate's studies): AGN 115 or AGP 103; AGN 215, AGB 144, AGR 157, AGR 301, AGS 101
- Complete any thirty-five credit hours of upper-division courses in agriculture, and reach a minimum of 120 total credit hours
- Complete AGR 499 Internship
